I was born in New York City on October 19, 1955. When I was about a year old, my family moved to Newark, New Jersey, where I spent my childhood. In 1987, I decided to try my hand at writing about something I always loved-sports. This led to my first adult baseball book. In 1992, when my son, Sam, was two years old, I decided to try writing for children. I wrote a few baseball books, then branched out to other sports--ice skating and gymnastics.

Up until this point, all my books were non-fiction. I never thought I would be any good at creating a story, but in 1994, I decided to give fiction a try. Surprisingly, I sold the first novel I wrote ("They Came From Centerfield"). It was fun to write, kids loved it, and I discovered how incredibly rewarding it is to take a blank page and turn it into a **WORLD**. Finally, after fifteen years, I figured out what my career should be - writing fiction for kids. Kids often tell me that my books make them laugh. This is funny to me, because writing humor was what I wanted to do when I got started back in 1980! It just took me a while to figure out the best way to do it.
