#### **Principal's Report - Chris Adkins**

On October 27 at Ferson Creek, Dr. Schlomann will be talking about enrollment vs. options for schools, redistricting, and boundaries. There will be a question/answer opportunity. If you are unable to attend, please visit the district website for information about presentations at other schools in the district.

Please ask students what small moment they wrote about each day. Ferson is implementing new writing programs with a focus on components of writing and using language to convey meaning versus narrative, expository, or persuasive styles.

Mrs. Tjaden's son (Andy, 31 yrs old) recently passed away. The family has asked for our respect and understanding in preserving their privacy during this very difficult time. Memorials may be donated to Anderson Pet Shelter. Cards from children are appreciated and Ferson can help deliver; however, Ferson will not disclose any personal information. PARCC testing results are available at the state level; however no Ferson or District 303 information is available. The average state elementary score was ~30% passing; no high school passed the reading test. Ferson often has a higher than state average on assessments, but no data is available yet and we do not know when we can expect more information. Changes have already been announced for this school year: there will be one testing session, not two, which will run sometime in March-May.

As a safety reminder, please refrain from using cell phones while driving in the school zone during school hours, including hands-free devices. This is a state law. Also, please maintain a safe speed.

The school is in dire need of substitute teachers. There is an easy application process with a small fee. Substitutes can choose how often they work and have a very flexible schedule and preferences. There is a 4-year degree requirement. Lunchroom help also needed.
